MARCH 23 PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE PRIMARY REMINDERS

BATON ROUGE, La. — Secretary of State Nancy Landry reminds voters that Saturday, March 23 is Election Day for the Presidential Preference Primary and Municipal Primary Election.

In preparation for the election, Secretary Landry encourages voters to remember:

• The Presidential Preference Primary is a closed party primary, which means only registered Democrats and Republicans will be allowed to vote in their party's respective primary. However, there are local elections in 24 parishes in which all voters may cast their ballots, regardless of party, if their jurisdiction is included. Voters are encouraged to check their voter registration—including party affiliation—before the registration deadlines.

- The deadline to register to vote in person, by mail, or at the OMV office is Feb. 21.
- The deadline to register to vote through the <u>GeauxVote Online Registration System</u> is March 2.
- Early voting is March 9 16 (excluding Sunday, March 10) from 8:30 a.m. 6 p.m. Early voting locations can be found at <u>voterportal.sos.la.gov/earlyvoting</u>.
- The deadline to request an absentee ballot is March 19 by 4:30 p.m. (other than military and overseas voters). Voters can request an absentee ballot online through the <u>Voter Portal</u> or in writing through the Registrar of Voters Office.
- The deadline for a <u>registrar of voters</u> to receive a voted absentee ballot is March 22 by 4:30 p.m. (other than military and overseas voters).
- Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. on Election Day. Anyone in line at 8 p.m. will be allowed to vote.
- Voters can find their polling location and sample ballot by downloading the GeauxVote Mobile app for smartphones, or by visiting <u>www.GeauxVote.com</u> and logging into the <u>Voter Portal</u>.
- Voters can sign up for electronic notifications via GeauxVote Mobile.
- Voters should bring an ID with them to vote (Louisiana driver's license, Louisiana Special ID card, a generally recognized picture identification card with name and signature such as a passport, or a digital license via LA Wallet).
- Election results can be viewed in real-time via GeauxVote Mobile or at <u>www.sos.la.gov</u>.
