WHAT ARE WE VOTING FOR?

Gubernatorial elections are held to elect a governor, along with all other statewide offices. Every voter in the state will have these offices on their ballots, in addition to proposed amendments to the Louisiana Constitution.

Seats in the Louisiana legislature are also on the ballot for this election. Most voters will have a State Representative race and/or a State Senator race on their ballots, as well as a seat on the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education

Voters in all parishes will have local parishwide offices on their ballots. All parishes will have one or more local elections, and some parishes will also have local proposition elections.

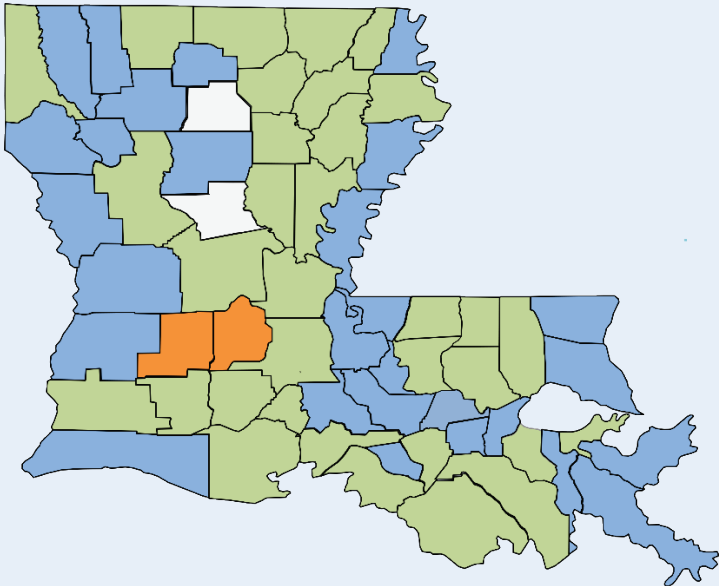

LOUISIANA AT A GLANCE

In addition to statewide, parishwide, and local races, as well as Constitutional Amendments, in all parishes:

- 33 parishes will have legislature races and local propositions:** Acadia, Assumption, Avoyelles, Caddo, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Franklin, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lafourche, LaSalle, Livingston, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Orleans, Ouachita, Rapides, Richland, St. Charles, St. Helena, St. Landry, St. Mary, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, Union, Vermilion, and West Carroll.
- 27 parishes will have legislature races but no local propositions:** Ascension, Beauregard, Bienville, Bossier, Cameron, Concordia, DeSoto, East Carroll, Iberville, Jefferson, Lincoln, Plaquemines, Pointe Coupee, Red River, Sabine, St. Bernard, St. James, St. John, St. Martin, St. Tammany, Tensas, Vernon, Washington, Webster, West Baton Rouge, West Feliciana, and Winn.
- 2 parishes will have local propositions but no legislature races:** Allen and Evangeline.
- 2 parishes will have no legislature or local proposition elections:** Grant and Jackson.
