EARLY VOTING BEGINS SATURDAY FOR SPRING MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

The Louisiana Secretary of State's Office is encouraging all Louisianians eligible to vote in the spring municipal election cycle to consider voting early. Early voting begins Saturday, March 10 and continues through Saturday, March 17 from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily, excluding Sunday, March 11.

Voters should utilize Louisiana's award-winning smartphone app, Geaux Vote Mobile, to find out where to early vote as well as what's on their ballot. In addition to a variety of local candidate and proposition elections in 41 parishes*, there are also two open state representative seats in Districts 93 (Orleans) and 86 (Tangipahoa) which could be of regional interest and several judicial races.

Citizens who want to vote early may do so in person at their parish Registrar of Voters Office or at other designated locations. For a complete listing of early voting locations, visit https://voterportal.sos.la.gov/EarlyVoting.

Election Day for the spring municipal election is Saturday, March 24 with the General Election scheduled for Saturday, April 28.
