SECRETARY ARDOIN TO TRAVEL TO AREAS IMPACTED BY HURRICANE IDA

BATON ROUGE, La. — Louisiana Secretary of State Kyle Ardoin announced that he will visit several parishes in South Louisiana that were affected by Hurricane Ida, beginning Tuesday, September 21 and ending Thursday, September 23.

“Our communities were ravaged by Hurricane Ida. The storm might have passed, but we still have work to do getting some of our operations and facilities back in working order,” Ardoin said. “I want to hear directly from our local officials about what remains to be done to get our Registrar of Voters and Clerk of Court offices, early voting locations and Election Day polling places ready for the fall elections on November 13.”

Secretary Ardoin will be traveling to 10 of the parishes affected by Hurricane Ida. His tentative schedule is as follows:
