Early voting is scheduled in each parish through SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 14TH from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily, excluding WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 11TH due to the Veterans Day holiday.

Voters should utilize Louisiana's award winning smartphone app, GeauxVote Mobile, to find out where to vote, what's on their ballot and their voting districts. Statewide, there are more than 153 candidate races including races for governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general and a number of legislative seats.
