## ELECTORAL COLLEGE TO MEET AT STATE CAPITOL

**BATON ROUGE, La.**—Secretary of State Kyle Ardoin will host the meeting of Louisiana's Electoral College on **Monday, Dec. 14 at 11:30 a.m. in the Senate Chamber of the State Capitol.** Secretary Ardoin will administer the oaths of office to the eight electors of the Republican Party prior to their official votes for president and vice president of the United States.

Louisiana's electors include: Vinson Serio, at large; Woody Jenkins, at large; Eric Skrmetta, 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District; Bob Monti, 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District; Ross Little, 3<sup>rd</sup> Congressional District; Rodney Michael Collier, 4<sup>th</sup> Congressional District; Kay Kellogg Katz, 5<sup>th</sup> Congressional District; and Beth A. Billings, 6<sup>th</sup> Congressional District. In the event that one of these electors is not present, an alternative elector will assume his/her duties by law.

The Electoral College, administered by the National Archives and Records Administration, is a process that began as part of the original design of the United States Constitution. The Founding Fathers established the Electoral College as a compromise between election of the president by Congress and election by a popular voter. The people of the United States vote for the electors who then vote for president.
