Military Personnel Powers of Attorney (LAC 19:V.101)

Pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act (R.S. 49:950 et seq.) and under the authority of R.S. 9:3865 and R.S. 36:742, the Department of State is repealing LAC19:V.101 which required the department to adopt a uniform statutory power of attorney form for military personnel. During the 1995 Regular Legislative Session, Act 1131 repealed the provisions of R.S. 9:3865 and amended R.S. 9:3862 to provide an illustrative and suggestive power of attorney form to be used by military personnel or other eligible persons who reside or own immovable property in the state.
